## PROFESSIONAL REGULATORY BOARD OF MEDICAL TECHNOLOGY RESOLUTION NO. <u>07</u> Series of 2022

## APPROVAL OF APPLICATIONS FOR REGISTRATION WITHOUT EXAMINATION AS MEDICAL LABORATORY TECHNICIANS

**WHEREAS,** Section 21(3)<sup>1</sup> of Republic Act (R.A.) No. 5527, also known as the "Philippine Medical Technology Act of 1969", as amended, states that the Professional Regulatory Board of Medical Technology (Board) shall issue a certificate of registration as medical laboratory technician without examination, subject to compliance with the conditions therein prescribed;

**WHEREAS**, the Professional Regulation Commission (Commission) issued Memorandum Order No. 01 (s. 2020) on the "Revised Guidelines on Transmittal and Action of 'For the Board' (FTB) application documents from the Regional Offices";

**WHEREAS,** for consideration of the Board are the following applicants for registration without examination as Medical Laboratory Technicians in accordance with Section 21(3) of R.A. No. 5527, as amended:
